Damage to Air-Strip

At a recent Committee meeting reference was made to the fact that a tractor and tractor owned by the Club had been observed being driven across the Air-Strip and in view of the damage that might have been caused I have been asked to draw your attention to the matter.

Considerable expense has been incurred in having the Air-Strip brought up to the standard required under the licence issued for scheduled flights to be made from the Air-Strip and accordingly a large notice was erected warning motorists and other vehicular drivers prohibiting the use of the air-strip. The Committee are greatly concerned at the disregard of the notice and also to the damage that might have been caused to the runway, particularly with regard to the danger that might have been caused to aircraft ultimately using the runway. It would be appreciated if this matter was brought to the attention of the staff of the Club.
