Details of Danny and Thomas McCulloch from their Great Niece, Jean Keighren.

DANNY MCCULLOCH

I am still piecing together information about Danny's war - unfortunately as a child I didn't take note of his many stories. The information I do have is from various documents and pay books, but is incomplete and is as follows:

10th August 1914 - enlisted in Seaforth Highlanders (possibly Golspie)

No information

28th July 1916 - until disembodiment, on active service in the field, 1/6 Seaforth Highlanders, Private D G McCulloch

21st March 1918 -promoted to Corporal D G McCulloch

23rd to 25th March 1918 - Military Medal for gallantry in the field

9th to 13th April 1918 - Military Medal for gallantry in the field

3rd July 1918 - travelled from Mont St Eloi to Le Touquet GHQ for a Lewis Gun course

9th March 1919 - disembodied (demobbed)

THOMAS MCCULLOCH

This is the information I have about Thomas McCulloch in WW1:

13-14th November 1916 - Private Thomas McCulloch of 1/5 Seaforth Highlanders, killed in action at Beaumont-Hamel, France, aged 23

29th December 1916 - his father, Donald McCulloch of 9 Carnaig Street, Dornoch, receives @999

a letter notifying the location of his grave at Mailly Wood Cemetery

27th October 1921 - Donald McCulloch receives Thomas McCulloch's British War and Victory medals with a letter from the Records Office in Perth.
