Extracts from Regulations for Registration of Postal Packets. (For full Regulations see Post Office Guide.)
GENERAL.
I. No compensation is paid in respect of a Postal Packet in which any prohibited article is contained.
II. No compensation is paid for consequential damage.
III. The decision of the Postmaster-General upon any claim for compensation is final.
IV. No legal liability attaches to the Postmaster-General in respect of the issue of this Certificate.
INLAND.
V. Subject to the published regulations, the Postmaster-General pays compensation for loss or damage to an Inland Postal Packet on which a Registration Fee has been paid, as follows—
VI. No compensation is paid in respect of any Registered Postal Packet containing MONEY or any other valuable articles, or of any official registered letter, or of any Postal Packet sent by Registered Letter Post, or of any money, securities, bonds, shares, currency notes, stamps, postal and railway receipts, cheques, and any other security for money, or of any other article, or of any article of value, whether negotiable or not. The maximum compensation for loss of GOLD is £5.
VII. No compensation is paid for damage to any packet, whether sent by Letter or Parcel Post, containing eggs, or fruit, or any exceptionally fragile article, or for damage to any packet sent by Letter Post containing liquor or similar liquid.
VIII. No compensation is paid for damage to a Postal Packet sent by Registered Letter Post, and containing an article of a fragile nature, care being taken.
IX. The Postmaster-General does not accept any liability as a consequence of the registration of a Postal Packet afterwards found to have been impermissibly packed.
X. The Postmaster-General does not in any case pay more than the actual value of the article lost or the amount of the damage sustained.
IMPERIAL AND FOREIGN.
XI. Registration is not a system of insurance, and the payment made in respect of loss or damage of contents is distinct from loss of the contents themselves, and the payment made in respect of loss of the contents is distinct from loss of the contents themselves.

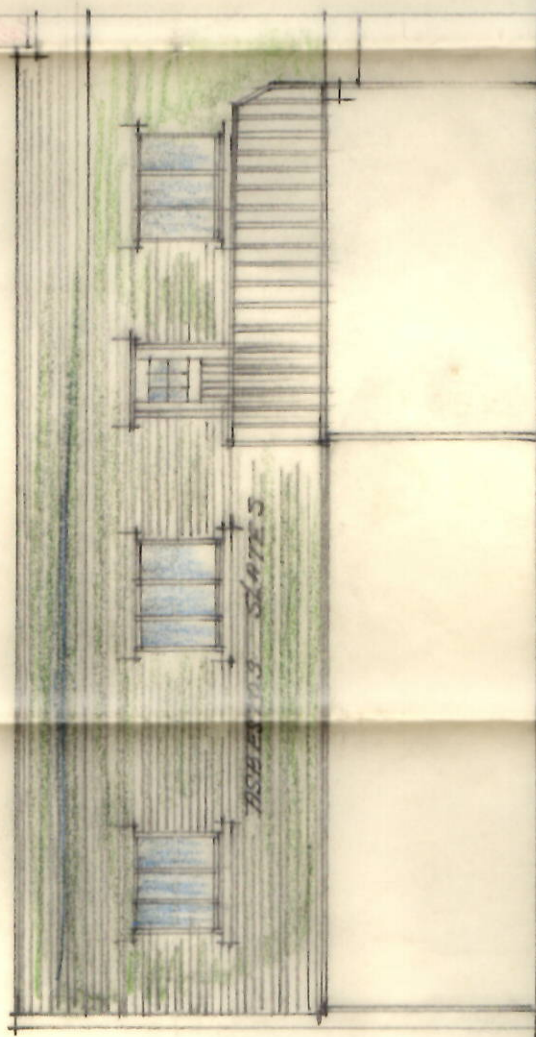
