I thank you for your letter enclosing list of names and photograph of proposed bronze plate. As I would require further information before quoting for this work I would be obliged if you would agree to the following.

1. Could you get your draughtsman to take a rubbing off one of the names on original bronze plate as the photograph, this would give me exact size and shape of lettering, and would be pleased let me know if the letters are half-round or square in section.
2. To get this amount of lettering into  $30" \times 24\frac{1}{4}"$  and balance properly all ranks would be abbreviations only and not in full as per your list.

Also I take it that  $30"$  is the height and  $24"$  the breadth of the plate not otherwise.

On hearing from you as to the above I shall be pleased to let you have my estimate for the work.

I thank you for your letter of the 20<sup>th</sup> Feb together with rubbing off lettering and putty cast.

On going into this matter I find that space is rather restricted for so much lettering, and as this proposed plate would have to be on the same lines as existing bronze, all ranks & regiments must be abbreviated.

Therefore the price for supplying cast bronze memorial plate 30" x 24 $\frac{1}{4}$ " overall, having inscription and 31 names with abbreviated ranks & regiments as described, letters with rounded surfaces would be £108-0-0 (One Hundred & Eight Pounds).

In the event of this estimate being accepted would you please have the list of names etc, rechecked for any possible errors as this would cause no end of trouble once the plate was cast

Dear Sir,

We are sorry we appear to have omitted to write you after my call on you, and hope the delay has not inconvenienced you in any way.

As promised, I inspected the memorial, with a view to submitting an estimate for the recess on the North panel, and for the Bronze plate. I found that some of the stones do not appear in a very good condition and we are unable on this account, to give an estimate for sinking as the existing panels are done with a Moulding all round, and the stones might open up, and prove unsatisfactory, and require a considerable amount of stepping.

The only thing I could suggest that might help, would be to leave ~~them~~ out the Bottle Moulding all round, and just sink the Bronze panel flush with the face of the stone, which will not cost very much. Or, as an alternative, place the panel on the ~~the~~ face, without sinking.

Sorry for the delay, but hope this information will be helpful.



The list of names has now been re-advertised and I now enclose it along with the photograph of the existing bronze plate. Another name has been added making 32 in all.

On thinking matters over I feel that in view of the amount of lettering which you will have to put into 30" X 24" you might increase the size of the plate to say 32" X 26". My reason for making this suggestion is that the Local Committee has now decided to leave out the bottle moulding as the stone of the memorial might open up and require considerable stopping if interfered with. The plate which you are supplying will therefore be sunk flush with the face of the stone and nothing more is to be done. Consequently a slightly larger bronze plate will not be noticed very much.

I shall be glad to hear from you with any observations you may have to make.


