## ROYAL BURGH OF DORNOCH

Bye-laws made and enacted by the Provost, ragistrates and Town Council upon the twentyninth day of April and the second day of ray both in the year Eighteen hundred and ninety five.

Whereas it is expedient to make bye-laws for the Dornoch Links, lying within the Burgh for regulating the use of the same; and for ensuring good order in the use thereof:-

The Provest, Magistrates and Town Council, as such, and as Commissioners under the Eurgh Police (Scotland) Act 1892 do hereby make and enact the following

## BYE-LAWS

- 1. DEFINITION For the purpose of these hye-laws the expression or term "the Links" shall mean and include that area of pasture land or links, within and belonging in property to the Burgh and subject to the administration and control of its Magistrates and Town Council, extending from the Earls Cross on the East to the march with the old commonty lands of Lonemors, on the West.
- II. CANTING No person shall enter upon or pass over any part of the links with a loaded or empty cart or other vehicle, except on the following tracks, viz:-
- (a) The existing track leading from the East end of Golf Hoad, eastwards to the quarry at or near Dornoch Hocks.
- (b) The existing track leading off from the track (a) at the brow of the hill above the sea beach, towards the Dulce rocks.
- (c) A track leading from the south end of Shore Hoad, southwards, immediately to the east of the dyke forming the eastern boundary of the Glebe or farm of the Parish Minister, thence in a straight line to the shore at the east end of the earthen Mound.

- (d) A track branching off from the track (c) at a point three hundred yards to the south of the south east corner of the Parish Minister's farm, and thence to the Dornoch point in a straight line for the hillock thereon known as the Tottan Rhud.
- (e) A track leading behind the River or Well Streets and straight eastwards to the shore at the east end of Littletown.
- III. GRAZING The inhabitants of the Burgh shall be entitled, as use is, to graze horses and cattle and their followers, but not sheep, on the links, paying to the Common Good of the Burgh the dues therefor used and wont. Every person allowing or permitting a horse to graze on the links shall shackle it, and keep it shackled, so long as it grazes thereon.
- IV. TURF &c:- No person shall cut, destroy, or tirr the turf of the links on any pretext whatsoever; nor deposit rubbish thereon, nor commit any nuisance thereon; nor use profane or obscene language thereon; and further, no person shall erect or place any booth, circus, tent or building thereon, unless with the permission of the Town Council, signified in writing under the hand of the Town Clerk.
- V. GOLF (a) No person shall play the game of golf on the links, except along the existing Golf Course, or such other course as may be prescribed by the Town Council, and all players shall, in playing, maintain the proper order of holes, and shall not play or pass from one hole to another out of that order when there is any risk of disturbing or molesting any other players of the game.
- (b) Every person shall tee his ball within the marks indicating the teeing ground, and in teeing his ball he shall not raise the turf of the teeing ground.
- (c) No person shall tee his bell until the immediately preceding players shall have played off; nor played his teed ball until each of the players immediately in front shall have played their second strokes, and be out of reach and also except in the case of a "lost ball".

- (d) Any turf cast or displaced by a stroke in playing must be at once carefully replaced by the player or his caddie and pressed firmly down with the foot.
- (e) No person shall drive a ball off a putting green.
- (f) No person shall wilfully or malliciously injure or destroy any of the folling holes, flags, sand boxes, or putting greens.
- VI. OTHER CAMES No other games or sports shall be played on the links, except such portions thereof as may from time to time be prescribed by the Town Council, to whom power is hereby given reserved to point out, or to set apart, any portion off the links for the purposes of such games or sports.
- VII. FOOTBALL We person shall play the game of football on the links, except on, (a) that portion thereof to the south of the Dornoch River, beyond the present Golf Course; and (b) that portion thereof lying between Golf Road and Littletown portion (b) to be exclusively reserved for boys under the age of sixteen years.
- VIII. TOLLS OR CHARGES. No person shall levy or attempt to levy any toll or charge on any of the community of the Burgh entering on, or passing over, the links, or any part thereof, subject to these Byelaws.
- IX. MISCRILANEOUS. No person shall molest or annoy other persons, or the property of such persons, using the links for any of the purposes set forth in, and subject to, these Bye-laws; nor shall any person injure, mark, or destroy any of the seats placed or to be placed by the Town Council on the links.
- X. = CUNTRAVENTIONS Any person contravening any of the foregoing Bye-Laws shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding TEN SHILLINGS for each breach of such Bye-Laws, and failing payment, to imprisonment for any period not exceeding SEVEN days. Provided that the Magistrate before whom any penalty imposed hereby is sought to/

to/ be recovered, may order the whole or part only of such penalty to be paid, or remit the whole penalty.

Bye-Laws made and enacted by the Provost, Magistrates, and Councillors, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by the Burgh Police (Scotland) Act, 1892, and of every other power enabling them in that behalf DO hereby MAXE, and ENACT the following

for the further regulation and control of the Dornoch Links

BYE-LAWS.

- 1. For the purposes of these Bye-Laws the expression or term "the links" shall have the same meaning as in the Bye-Laws made and enacted by the Provost, Magistrates, and Councillors upon the 9th April and 2nd May 1895; APPROVED and Confirmed by the Sheriff 14th June 1895; and CONFIRMED by the Secretary for Scotland, 12th August 1895.
- 2. No games shall be played on the links on Sundays. 3./

3. Any person contravening these Bye-Laws shall be liable on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Ten Shillings for each breach of these Bye-Laws, and, failing payment to imprisonment for any period not exceeding Seven days. provided that the Maxistrate before whom any penalty imposed hereby is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only of such penalty to be paid, or may remit the whole penalty.
