### DORNOCH AURODROME

I refer to your letter of 13 Mebruary 1970 and to our previous letters or even reference on this subject. In your application you give the Grun ar Grose at 3,200 lbs as the heaviest mireraft, and this conditions the scale of fire/crash effort which will require to be provided. However, assuming a sevement rate of less than 50 a month (a movement is a take off or landing) for this mireraft allows us to reduce our required Fire Category from TII to II. This requires 100 galls of mater and 5 galls of foam as the principle agents, on a mobile basis of course, with a total discharge rate of 40 galls per minute. The supplementary agents are 50 lbs Coa or 50 lbs dry chemical. The ampower requirement to operate this scale is three trained sen. I notice from your letter that you are awaiting estimates for fire/crash equipment and I would strongly recommend that you take advice on this matter from our Divisional Fire Service Officer on ext 529 at this Office.

With regard to the agrodrome, I have assumed that the area which you intend to license is the unshaded area marced golf course on your map, and I have taken the liberty of pencilling in an idea for the layout of two "ranway" airections. This is no sore than a suggestion and of course may not be possible, "on the ground", and may not be compatible with minimum expense in the layout of the aerodrome. The maway 20/02 as shown is 500 feet long and will require to be 100 ft mide but if the length is reduced to 3000 ft them the width need only be 75 ft. The subsidiary "ranway" 28/10 need only be 75 ft. The lateral boundaries of the "ranway" should be marked by white flat rectangular markers 10 ft long, 3 ft wide at intervals no greater than 500 ft. These markers should also mark the ends of the ranways, and, of course, should be flush with the grass surface. No particular method or type of marker is laid down but at other grass aerodromes successful use has been made of concrete Mahs "sunk" into the ground and Snowcemed. The dimensions of the markers do not have to be precisely 10 ft x 5 ft.

If you prefer not to provide particular directions for take of or landing, the shold marodrone area can be made suitable for take off and landing as an "all mays" acrosrome and mircraft then simply land and take off into the prevailing wind. In this case the boundaries will require to be marked at regular intervals around the area.

The provision of a windsock is necessary, and it is suggested that warning nations strategically placed would be neeful since it is Common Good land. However there maybe legal reasons for not doing this.

Normally a physical licensing inspection is carried out when an aerodrome is considered to be ready for operational use. This includes inspection of fire/crash equipment and testing of personnel who have been nominated to man it. The third paragraph of your letter seems to indicate that the aerodrome is not yet ready for inspection and I would suggest that you delay applying for a licence until such time as you consider that it is. As you can see from the application form the licensing fee in your case would be \$25.

For the time being I am returning your application form and chart, and the DFSO and myself will be only too happy to offer our advice whenever you may feel in need of it.

Finally, I would suggest that you might find it useful to contact the County Surveyor of Oraney, Mr Melrose, who has had considerable experience in recent years in all aspects of making and maintaining grass aerodromes, in retaining and training personnel for fire/orash duties, and in purchasing specialist fire/orash equipment. I am sure he would be only too pleased to pass on his experience.
